First-year or Third-year students in five-year term doctoral program of Graduate School of Asian and African Area Studies, Graduate School of Advanced Integrated Studies in Human Survivability, or Graduate School of Medicinal Frontier Sciences of Pharmaceutical Sciences

First-year students of Graduate School of Government

First-year students of Graduate School of Management

First-year students of Graduate School of Law

First-year students of Faculty of Medicine or School of Human Health Sciences or Students who are scheduled to undergo clinical practice

Students who engage in clinical work or contact to patients

Research students · Credited auditors · Auditors

Students who are scheduled to undergo teaching practice or hospital practice or nursing care practice

Over 40-years old

Students who had abnormal findings in the chest X-ray last year or Students who are directed to take annual check

Transfer students in their first year

### Omission of Chest X-Ray

If any of the following apply to you, you must request this at the Interview with a medical professional.

- 1) Those who are required to have a chest X-ray but need to omit it due to the possibility of pregnancy or other reasons.
- 2) Those who have had a chest X-ray taken since January of this year. It may be possible to omit it.
